2011 Auction Napa Valley Grants - \$6.85 Million!

Auction Napa Valley's emphasis for 2011 grant awards focus on near-term essential needs under these priorities:

- *Health and Wellness*—providing health care for individuals in need
- *Children and Youth*—promoting success in school
- *Housing*—helping to keep people in their homes and to avoid homelessness

Many of the programs funded by ANV connect more than one priority, creating comprehensive coordination of care for Napa County residents.

Health and Wellness— providing health care for individuals in need: \$3,715,000

Aldea Children & Family Services: **Countywide Mental Health First Aid Training \$75,000**

Aldea aims to raise awareness of mental health issues in the community and lower the associated stigma, while also providing referral coordination and services to those in need.

American Canyon Family Resource Center: **Community Health Access Project \$40,000**

Funds will provide case management services for families in American Canyon, addressing their health and economic needs.

Area Agency on Aging: **StopFalls Napa Valley \$30,000**

SFNV works to prevent falls through education and home modifications, allowing low income seniors to remain independent with safer conditions in their current housing.

Calistoga Affordable Housing: **Rebuilding Calistoga \$30,000**

CAH and StopFalls Napa Valley will send teams of volunteers to homes in Calistoga to make repairs and implement safety modifications that improve the living conditions of senior and disabled residents.

Children's Health Initiative Napa County: **Health Insurance for All Children \$250,000**

CHI provides health insurance enrollment assistance to uninsured/underinsured children, and case management ensuring access to needed health services and continued coverage.

Community Action of Napa Valley: **Meals on Wheels for the Non-Senior Disabled Program \$20,000**

This funding provides daily nutritious meals to low-income, homebound, severely disabled individuals.

Community Health Clinic Ole: **Care for the Underserved \$700,000**

Grant funding will support quality, affordable primary and preventive medical, behavioral health and education services to Napa County's low-income, uninsured and underinsured residents.

Community Health Clinic Ole: **Healthy Moms and Babies \$200,000**

Funding will support perinatal services for Napa County's low-income pregnant women.

Community Health Clinic Ole: Sister **Ann Dental Services Program \$400,000**

Sister Ann provides quality, affordable, dental services and dental health education to Napa County's low-income, uninsured residents.

Cope Family Center & Calistoga Family Center: **SAFE Families \$175,000**

SAFE (Self-Sufficiency, Access to Services, Freedom from Violence & Education) Families intervenes early to improve children's and families' psychological/social functioning through child abuse prevention efforts & basic needs services.

Family Service of Napa Valley: **Bridges \$175,000**

Bridges is a collaboration of Napa County agencies that share the common mission of serving individuals and families in need, providing mental health services to clients of eight community organizations.

Gunilda Rianda Senior Center: **Healthy Minds & Healthy Bodies \$30,000**

This program keeps older individuals (ages 65+) in the upper Napa Valley mentally and physically fit to help maintain long-term health and the ability to remain independent.

JJN Wolfe Center: **Alcohol and Drug Prevention and Treatment \$125,000**

Funding will provide access to school-based substance abuse services for Napa County youth, ages 12 to 18.

Napa CASA: **A Voice for Children \$40,000**

CASA provides advocacy and support for abused and neglected children ages 0-18 with a full year of comprehensive services.

Napa County Health & Human Services Public Health Division: **Welcome Every Baby \$60,000**

This program will continue to provide nurse in-home visits for infants born in Napa County and their families, intervening early to improve psychological and social functioning.

Napa Emergency Women's Services (NEWS): **Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Prevention Education and Intervention \$125,000**

NEWS services are dedicated to breaking the cycle of sexual abuse and domestic violence.

Napa Valley Child Advocacy Network (ParentsCAN): **Family Resource Center Liaison Project \$20,000**

ParentsCAN will work in partnership with local Family Resource Centers to assure children with disabilities and their families receive needed comprehensive services.

Napa Valley Hospice and Adult Day Services: **Core Program Support \$100,000**

Funds support agency's Adult Day Services for people with chronic or terminal illness ensuring equal access to services those who may be underserved due to income, geographic and cultural barriers.

Planned Parenthood: Shasta-Diablo: **Comprehensive Reproductive Healthcare \$65,000**

Grant funding will support the program's Napa Health Center and satellite site at the Napa Health Department by providing reproductive healthcare to under-served individuals and families.

Planned Parenthood: Shasta-Diablo: **Prevention-Based Education and Outreach Programs \$40,000**

Support for reproductive health education and outreach efforts for middle and high school age youth throughout Napa County.

Queen of the Valley Medical Center Foundation: **Vintners Assistance Fund for Indigent Care \$400,000**

Funding will provide acute medical care to the uninsured and under-insured of Napa County.

St. Helena Family Center: **Service Connections and Building Strong Communities \$40,000**

Funds will provide access to safety net services and comprehensive family support.

St. Helena Hospital Foundation: **Healthcare for the Indigent \$400,000**

Funding will provide acute medical care to the uninsured and under-insured of Napa County

The Salvation Army-Napa Corps : **Neighborhood Table \$75,000**

This program provides hot lunchtime meals to anyone who is hungry, serving between 120-150 people per day as well as providing daily meals to the South Napa Shelter.

The Women's Center: **Chronic Disease Prevention \$100,000**

This program will provide mammograms, breast ultrasounds, bone density tests, and cardiac risk screenings to individuals in the community who cannot afford them.

Within 2011 healthcare grants is included a \$750,000 contribution from the Napa Valley Vintners' Healthcare Fund, known as the Robert Mondavi Fund in honor of Auction Napa Valley's founding vintner, the late Robert Mondavi.

Housing— helping to keep people in their homes and to avoid homelessness: \$980,000

Calistoga Affordable Housing: **CAH Operations \$30,000**

This grant supports operations to continue its programs, explore five new housing development opportunities and conduct a workforce feasibility analysis.

Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Santa Rosa: **Rainbow House \$50,000**

Funds support this home for pregnant or parenting mothers and will provide intensive case management directed toward stabilizing families and preparing them for successful, independent lives.

Community Action of Napa Valley: **Homeless Prevention and Rapid Rehousing \$300,000**

This county-wide collaborative offers financial assistance and services to prevent at-risk individuals and families from becoming homeless, and to help those who are experiencing homelessness to be quickly re-housed.

Fair Housing Napa Valley: **Landlord-Tenant Service Expansion \$100,000**

Funding will provide landlord-tenant services and advocacy to families affected by housing issues such as delayed repairs, and various health and safety issues.

Housing and Economic Rights Advocates (HERA): **Foreclosure Intervention and Prevention \$30,000**

HERA will provide legal advice, housing advocacy and financial assessments for homeowners facing possible foreclosure.

Legal Aid of Napa Valley: **Immigrant Legal Services \$100,000**

Funds will provide free legal assistance to immigrants helping them to stay healthy, remain housed and meet their basic needs.

Napa County Housing Authority: **Farm Worker Centers \$120,000**

ANV funding will support critical health and safety systems at three farm worker centers serving seasonal agricultural workers.

Napa Valley Community Housing: **Home Stabilization \$150,000**

Through the agency's resident services, funds will provide education, training, referrals, intervention and advocacy to address immediate needs of residents.

Napa Valley Community Housing: **Housing Development \$100,000**

These funds will support ongoing work necessary to develop, build and manage affordable housing for very-low, low and moderate-income households including pre-development work on two new properties.

Children and Youth— promoting success in school: \$1,353,500

Big Brothers Big Sisters of the North Bay: **Community-Based Mentoring \$37,500**

Funding will support the one-to-one mentoring where screened and trained volunteer adult mentors are matched with underserved youth ages 6 -17.

Boys & Girls Clubs of Napa Valley: **After School Education & Enrichment \$300,000**

The agency will operate youth development programs at 13 locations throughout American Canyon and Napa, K-12th grade students, every day after-school.

Boys & Girls Clubs of St. Helena and Calistoga: **After-School Education & Safety (ASES) \$150,000**

The ASES program creates a seamless educational, social and recreational day for school-aged children.

Child Start, Inc.: **Raising A Reader \$45,000**

Funding will support Raising A Reader, an evidence based early literacy and parent engagement program which improves the reading readiness skills of young children.

CyberMill Technology Center: **Youth Program \$60,000**

This program grant builds on the successful ANV funded Middle School Connections and PC2Home, with grant funds for bi-lingual technology instructor to train students and parents.

Girls on the Run Napa Valley: **Girls on the Run \$15,000**

Funding will support low-income students' participation in this after-school program that combines youth development curriculum and experiential activities to help girls grow emotionally, physically and socially.

Napa Valley Adult Education: **First Step/Next Step \$126,000**

Support for the summer bilingual kindergarten transition program for parents and children who have had little or no pre-school experience

NapaLearns: **Project Based Learning Countywide Rollout \$200,000**

This project rolls-out the ANV funded SC21 Project Based Learning program to middle schools throughout Napa County.

NapaLearns: **Countywide Virtual Kindergarten Readiness Initiative \$50,000**

This project extends the First Step/Next Step kindergarten preparation summer program for English language learners to include a year-long virtual program for students and parents throughout their kindergarten year to help close the early achievement gap.

On The Move: **Opportunities Initiative \$150,000**

The initiative will engage children, youth and their families – primarily low-income and Latino – in solidifying academic achievement, ensuring family wellness and self-sufficiency, and supporting high school graduation, college entry and career success.

On The Move: **V.O.I.C.E.S. Youth Center \$80,000**

Funds will support underserved youth in accessing services to ensure high school graduation and college entry, employment, housing, and access to counseling and health services while building trusted relationships.

Project Night Night: **Reducing Trauma and Increasing Educational Opportunities \$10,000**

This innovative non-profit program provides age-appropriate items of comfort, to disadvantaged children in order to reduce trauma and to promote success in school.

Puertas Abiertas Community Resource Center: **Middle School Connections \$30,000**

This program is designed to increase parents' knowledge and understanding of family resources and their ability to create a home learning environment that positively impacts student school performance and academic achievement.

St. Helena Family Center/Calistoga Family Center: **Up Valley Student Assistance \$100,000**

Funding will provide services to students seeking support or needing interventions for substance abuse, mental health or social issues that affect academics, behavior and school attendance.

Community Shared Resources: **Capacity Building Grants \$50,000**

In partnership with The E. Richard Jones Family Foundation, Napa Valley Community Foundation, and the Peter A. and Vernice H. Gasser Foundation, ANV funds of \$50,000 have been added to support 24 grants to non-profit health and human service organizations working in Napa County.

Napa Valley Vintners Community Health Center: **Capital Investment \$750,000**

A one-time grant from the Healthcare Fund to purchase property for future expansion at the NVV Community Health Center, home to Community Health Clinic Ole, Sister Ann Dental Clinic, Healthy Moms and Babies and NEWS (Napa Emergency Women's Services) in Napa.
